EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD Byzantine Catholic Church The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation - (Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist). We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) is imparted at the same time immediately following baptism

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechuminate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. Couples will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions – to begin the pre-nuptial investigation, to take FOCCUS, a communications, values and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the pre-nuptial investigation and for a session on the theology of the mystery (sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM – 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) on Sundays between the Divine Liturgies. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week to prepare for the observance of the Lord's Resurrection.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the sacrament of penance and anointing of the sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church before entering the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance of interruption for confession and anointing. If you are unable to come to church, please call the rectory. Families of parishioners who have a medical emergency should contact the rectory office so one of the priests can go the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacon on Sundays and at other times by arrangement. Please contact the deacon or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery is a portion of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see the deacon.

Phase III Icon Update. Of the four icons of the third phase of the Icon Program to complete the new church, two have found donors: the Dormition of the Theotokos and the Resurrection of Christ. The Crucifixion (\$11,760) and the Communion of the Apostles (\$24,800) are still available for donation. Multiple donors can unite to donate the Communion of the Apostles using the following schedule. There are sixteen figures on this large icon which covers the back wall of the Holy Place under the Platytera of the Mother of God. The figures are: the Lord Jesus holding the discos, the Lord Jesus holding the chalice (the Lord appears twice in this icon), the apostles: Saint Peter and Saint Paul, Saint Andrew the First-called, Saint James son of Zebedee, Saint John the Evangelist son of Zebedee, Saint Philip, Saint Thomas, Saint Matthew the

Evangelist, Saint Jude Thaddeus, Saint Bartholomew (also called Saint Nathanael), Saint James Adelphotheos (relative of God), Saint Simon the Zealot, two angels serving as deacons holding the liturgical fan, the ripidion. If sixteen donors select the subject they wish to offer, e.g., Our Lord, or an apostle, or an angel-deacon each would donate \$1,550 for each figure donated. Please recall that the iconographic representations are computer generated proposals to show approximately what the icon would look like in the space where it is to be installed. The icons for our church follow the Carpathian School and the final icon may be somewhat different.

Boiler Update. The eparchy has provided Epiphany of Our Lord with our final 2016 Bishop's Appeal total and the reversion we will receive. Epiphany parishioners donated \$21,110.00. Below please find our totals toward the replacement of the Parish Center boiler:

Prayers for our Parishioners. The particular law of the Byzantine Ruthenian Metropolitan Church directs: "The pastor is to celebrate the Divine Liturgy for the people of the parish entrusted to him on Sundays and days of precept

[holy days of obligation]” (canon 294). This liturgy intention for all parishioners is “For the intention of our Parishioners.” The faithful who attend the Divine Liturgy for the parishioners participate, according to their state, in praying for that intention. We can continue this prayer for one another during the week by remembering several parishioners and families each week. Please remember this week Nancy Stefan, Robert and Nancy Stegon, Joseph Stone, Edward and Miriam Strickland & Family, Joseph and Heather Strickland & Family, Robert and Jennifer Strickland & Family, Joel and Michelle Susco & Family, Thomas and Nancy Susco & Family, David and Rebecca Sweda, and from the Mission, Daniel and Sheila Hakun.

Blessed Palms and Willows should be kept in your home, usually at the icon corner or crucifix, as a witness to the Lord’s presence in your life. Last year’s palms and willows are blessed sacramentals and should be destroyed by burning or burying them or bring them to the hall in the chapel basement and place them in the receptacle provided. ***Do not throw them into the garbage.***

Pentecostarion for Pascha. The Pentecostarion, which means “Fifty Days” referring to the fifty days from Pascha to Pentecost, is the liturgy book that begins Great Saturday evening and continues until the Sunday of All Saints which is the Sunday after Pentecost Sunday. Another name for this collection of hymns and services is “Flowering Triodion”. The sixth Sunday after Pascha is called the **Sunday of the Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council.** The “Fathers” are the 318 bishops who participated in the council and the legates representing Pope Sylvester. This Sunday is part of the period of ten days from our Lord’s ascension into heaven to the sending of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. The gospel appointed for this Sunday is from Saint John’s account of the Mystical Supper when Jesus prays to the Father for His disciples He is leaving. This is often called the “High Priestly Prayer of Jesus”. It is appointed for this Sunday when the apostles and disciples were

without the bodily presence of Jesus who had ascended. The observance of the First Ecumenical Council on this Sunday is certainly because the council was held May 20-June 19, 325. However, a deeper application to this Sunday after Ascension is seen in the question which the council was faced with adjudicating: who is Jesus of Nazareth? Jesus had said: “the Father and I are One” (John 10:30) and “the Father is in me and I am in the Father” (John 10:38). However, what is to be made of the words of Jesus: “the Father is greater than I” (John 14:28)? This latter quote gave the priest Arius the opportunity to teach that Jesus is a little less than God but greater than humans. If he were right, Jesus’ death and resurrection could not save us since He would not be one with us and one with God. The bishops responded with the orthodox Catholic teaching: the Father eternally begets the Son and spirates the Holy Spirit. That is the only way the Father is understood as “greater”. (First there is equality of the Three Persons in One God the Holy Trinity and then there is order). In addition, the fathers made the unprecedented (to that point in time) step of inventing a word not in the New Testament to define the relationship of God the Father and Jesus, who calls Himself the Son of God. The word was *homoousios* a word that means “one in essence” or “one in being.” This definition of dogma is important for what occurred at Ascension. Jesus as Son of God is One, *homoousios*, with the Father and the Holy Spirit and always with the other persons of the Holy Trinity. After the Son of God was incarnate in the womb of the Blessed Virgin He became *homoousios* with us. At Ascension Jesus took human nature to heaven where as God He always is. This ascension opens heavens for all those who are baptized into Christ to follow: “Where the Head of His Body, Jesus, has gone before us in glory, we, the rest of the Body, are called to follow in hope.”

Paschal Rituals. Beginning Ascension you may resume sitting at the usual times. Kneeling does not resume until Pentecost Sunday.

Mother helping mothers. “Mary, Helper of Mothers” is a special icon of the Mother of God that women who are having difficulty conceiving, or for mothers who are having a difficult pregnancy, or expectant mothers who have had hard childbirth with their other children have recourse to in prayer. The icon was particularly effective in the Eparchy of Phoenix. Bishop Kurt has brought this devotion to assist the women of his eparchy. The annual Saint Nicholas Pilgrimage at Carpathian Village,

Cresco, PA will center on this holy icon on Sunday, July 9, 2017. The pilgrimage will begin at 11:00 AM with a Moleben to Saint Nicholas, the protector of the Byzantine Ruthenian Catholic Church and conclude at 6:00 PM with a panachida for deceased clergy and former pilgrims. Food service begins at 11:30AM. See information sheet on narthex bulletin board. If there is sufficient interest in any parish of the eparchy to host the holy icon of Mary, Helper of Mothers, please inform your pastor so he can ask the Bishop for a specific time for the icon to visit the parish.
