The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation - (Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist). We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) is imparted at the same time immediately following baptism.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechumenate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. Couples will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions – to begin the pre-nuptial investigation, to take FOCCUS, a communications, values and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the pre-nuptial investigation and for a session on the theology of the mystery (sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM – 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) on Sundays between the Divine Liturgies. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week to prepare for the observance of the Lord's Resurrection.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the sacrament of penance and anointing of the sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church before entering the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance of interruption for confession and anointing. If you are unable to come to church, please call the rectory. Families of parishioners who have a medical emergency should contact the rectory office so one of the priests can go the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacon on Sundays and at other times by arrangement. Please contact the deacon or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery is a portion of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see the deacon.

EPARCHIAL & OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Year of Mercy. Pope Francis asks us to be Christ-like and do the Spiritual Works of Mercy and the Corporal Works of Mercy. The third Corporal Work of Mercy is “to shelter the homeless”. The US Bishops suggest these as ways to accomplish this Corporal Work of Mercy. “There are many circumstances that could lead to someone becoming a person without a home. Christ encourages us to go out and meet those without homes, affirming their worth and helping them seek a resolution to the challenges they face. (1) See if your parish or diocese is involved with a local homeless shelter and volunteer some time. (2) Donate time or money to organizations that build homes for those who need shelter. (3) Many homeless shelters need warm blankets for their beds. If you can knit or sew that would be an extra loving gift. (4) There are millions of children and families who are on the move, fleeing from war, illness, hunger and impossible living conditions, and searching for peace and safety. Engage parish groups of children, youth, young adults, and families in doing some research on the causes and challenges that these families face to survive. Contact Catholic Social Services, or diocesan offices of peace and justice for help with your research. Seek ways to provide shelter for the homeless locally, regionally, nationally or internationally.”

Respect Life Vigil and March. This year the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe v. Wade* which legalized abortion will be observed as a day of penance for the violation of human dignity by abortion on Friday, January 22, 2016. The Prayer Vigil will be held at the Basilica of the National Shrine in Washington, DC with a Mass in the Great Upper Church at 5:30 PM. Compline celebrated by Bishop Kurt Burnette in the

Crypt Church has a different time assigned by the USCCB, 10:00 PM rather than 11:00 PM. Bishop Kurt Burnette will celebrate the Divine Liturgy Friday morning, January 22nd 10:00 AM at Epiphany Church. Parishioners are also requested to come and pray with Bishop Kurt at Compline and at the Divine Liturgy.

Compline Transportation. Parishioners interested in attending January 21 10:00 pm Compline at the National Basilica but who need free transportation are urged to contact Chris Braunlich at 571-212-0058 by January 19. Transportation will depart Epiphany at about 8:45 pm and return after completion of Compline services (which should end at 11:00 pm).

Banns of Ordination II. Deacon Lewis Michael Rabayda, son of Daniel and Patricia Rabayda, baptized at Saint John the Baptist Byzantine Catholic Church, Lansford, Pennsylvania, and a parishioner of Epiphany of our Lord Church, Annandale, VA, having completed the four year seminary formation at Ss. Cyril and Methodius Byzantine Catholic Seminary, is a candidate for the Sacrament of Ordination to the Holy Priesthood of Jesus Christ. If anyone knows any impediment or any grave reason that would impede ordination, such a person has a serious obligation to contact the pastor.

Ordination Gifts. Parishioners may have questions regarding suitable ordination gifts for Deacon Lewis. Deacon Lewis will need oil stock, small sick-call epitrachelion (priest's stole), and Holy Communion pyx for bringing Communion to sick and home-bound. He wishes a hand-carved wood blessing cross with bronze inlay. The price is \$2,200. Parishioners may wish to make offerings toward the blessing cross since it is expensive. Holy Supper. Holy Supper for Theophany will be today Sunday, January 10th, after the 10:30 AM Divine Liturgy in the Parish Center. All parishioners are invited to attend.

Holy Water. Holy Water blessed at the Divine Liturgy of Theophany is available in the church narthex today.

All Souls Saturdays. There are five All Souls Saturdays during the liturgical year when we pray the Divine Liturgy and remember our faithful departed by name. The first one this year is January 30th. Because of the ordination of Deacon Lewis Rabayda, Fr. Edward Higgins, eparchial master of liturgical ceremonies, has asked that the Divine Liturgy and the hramoty be on Friday, January 29th. If you wish to add any names to the list of persons remembered in your family, known as “diptychs” or “hramoty,” please use the appropriate envelope in the offertory envelope box. Please place it in the Sunday collection with the list of names you wish to add along with your offering for their remembrance. New parishioners should list the members of their faithful departed whom they wish to remember in prayer on the reverse side of the envelope. It is also permissible to simply list “all the departed of the (your family name) family” rather than each person by name. If you wish to update, delete or add new names to our hramoty Listing, please contact the Parish Office during office hours. Hramoty envelopes must be received on or before

January 17th to be remembered at all five All Souls Saturdays.

Fasting Regulations. The period free from all fasting began Christmas Day and ended January 5th, the Vigil Eve of Theophany. This week the usual fasting period resumes. Since every Friday is a weekly commemoration of Great Friday, Fridays during the year are Days of Penance, that is, we abstain from meat and meat products or do an appropriate penance or charitable work. Please note that because Pascha is early this year, there is no liturgical commemoration of the Sunday of Zacchaeus. Next Sunday is the Sunday of the Publican and Pharisee. The week of the Publican and Pharisee is a fast free week.
