The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation - (Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist). We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) is imparted at the same time immediately following baptism

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechumenate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. Couples will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions – to begin the pre-nuptial investigation, to take FOCCUS, a communications, values and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the pre-nuptial investigation and for a session on the theology of the mystery (sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM – 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) on Sundays between the Divine Liturgies. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week to prepare for the observance of the Lord's Resurrection.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the sacrament of penance and anointing of the sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church before entering the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance of interruption for confession and anointing. If you are unable to come to church, please call the rectory. Families of parishioners who have a medical emergency should contact the rectory office so one of the priests can go the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacon on Sundays and at other times by arrangement. Please contact the deacon or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery is a portion of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see the deacon.

End of Life Planning. Today, January 22, the second of three presentations to help us with end-of-life planning. Attorney John Rodock of our parish will discuss how to plan for Power of Attorney and the Catholic Church moral theology approved Medical Power of Attorney as well as Will preparation. Sunday, January 29th, Liturgical Preparations will be the topic. What are the options for church funerals? This preparation can help you make decisions in order to inform your family so that they can know and respect your wishes for a Catholic funeral and interment. Nut Roll Baking Job Opening. Epiphany Ladies Guild needs project managers for their biannual nut roll baking project. The proposal is to have two individuals to diversify the work: one project manager to head only the preparation of the nut filling on one day and the other project manager to only head the dough preparation, filling and baking on the following day. The proposal is to limit the yield to 500, nut only, rolls. This will help project managers ease into the responsibilities. As many parishioners know, Epiphany Ladies Guild nut, poppy-seed, prune (lekvar) and apricot rolls are a favorite with Northern Virginia public. ELG Lenten Dinners attendance grows in anticipation of the Friday when the rolls will go on sale and many rolls are purchased at the annual Slavic American Festival. National Prayer Vigil for Life. The 38th annual Pro-Life Vigil will be held as usual at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, DC. However, because of the inauguration this year the date has been moved from January 22 to Thursday, January 26th. The opening Mass will be 5:30 PM, celebrated by Timothy Cardinal Dolan in the Great Upper Church. Compline (Night Prayer) will be celebrated by Bishop Kurt Burnette at the Crypt Church at 10:00PM. Responses will be rendered by Epiphany cantors. Epiphany parishioners also serve each year as ushers. A van is being considered for transportation. If you wish to reserve a seat on the van, please see Chris Braunlich or contact the rectory office. The next morning January 27 prior to the March for Life at the National Mall, Bishop Kurt Burnette will offer a Divine Liturgy at Epiphany church. Participation in this Liturgy is for all and not just for March participants. A meal is being planned after the Liturgy.

EPARCHIAL AND OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Bishop's Appeal 2016. The parish goal for the church is \$19,800 as last year. Also, as last year if the parish reaches the goal it will receive a reversion of 40% of donations sent to the chancery. To date, 65 families have contributed \$17,635 toward our goal. We are only \$2,165 short of our goal. Through your generosity the parish reversions from recent Appeals given back to Epiphany parish have provided for necessary repairs and maintenance. The 2014 reversion, along with the Festival Raffle and individual gifts allowed us to replace the over 30 year old roof of the chapel. The reversion from the Bishop's Appeal 2015 is \$7,932.40 which is dedicated funds for the replacement of the Parish Center boiler. Added to the reversion,

\$3,841.00 has been donated by parishioners toward the replacement of the boiler in the Parish Center. The proceeds from this year's festival raffle was \$2,066. The Epiphany Ladies Guild has generously made a donation of \$15,000.00 toward the replacement of the parish center boiler, which brings the boiler fund up to \$24,998.40. The latest estimate for a new boiler is \$45,257.00. Sixty-five families have contributed \$13,635.00 to date of our 2016 Bishop's Appeal goal of \$19,800. Thank you for your generosity. It is not too late to make your 2016 pledge, which would help our Eparchy and our parish.

Vocations to the Priesthood. Our parish is blessed with many reverent and zealous men. Have you ever had thoughts about the Holy Priesthood? Possibly these thoughts might be that God is calling you to the Holy Priesthood. If you have questions please speak to Father John or contact the Vocations Director of the Eparchy of Passaic, Father Michael Kerestes (570) 822-6028. The first step is to meet with the Vocations Director. Then, if there is a possible vocation, the candidate is reviewed by the Vocations Board. If accepted by the board and the Bishop, the process of applying to the seminary begins. The traditional path is to enter the seminary as a single man and during the seminary to discern marriage or celibacy with the help of the spiritual director. The deadline for submitting a name to the Eparchial Vocations Board is January 30, 2017.
