The Sacraments – Our Life in Christ

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation - (Baptism, Chrismation, Holy Eucharist). We follow the command of the Lord to baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19). Chrismation (Confirmation) and Holy Eucharist (First Holy Communion) is imparted at the same time immediately following baptism.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Infants – is scheduled at the Divine Liturgy on Saturdays or Sundays during the year except certain fast periods. Sponsors must be Catholics in good standing and supply a sponsor card attesting to that from their parish. While two Catholics in good standing is usual, one baptized non-Catholic can function as a Christian Witness with the Catholic sponsor. Both must be at least sixteen years of age. Details are available at the parish office.

Mysteries (Sacraments) of Initiation of Adults – follows a period of catechuminate. This is a period of spiritual formation. Please see the priest or deacon.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Crowning in Marriage – According to the Pastoral Policy and Guidelines for Marriage Preparation for the Catholic Church in New Jersey, couples wishing to marry must inform the pastor one year before the date of the wedding and be free to marry in the Catholic Church. Couples will meet with the priest and deacon in four sessions – to begin the pre-nuptial investigation, to take FOCCUS, a communications, values and religious inventory approved for use in the Catholic dioceses/eparchies, to complete the pre-nuptial investigation and for a session on the theology of the mystery (sacrament). They are also required to attend Pre-Cana or Engaged Encounter.

Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance – The Mystery (Sacrament) of Repentance is regularly available each Saturday 11:30 AM – 12:00 Noon. In addition, confessions are heard during the Christmas Fast (Advent) and the Great Fast (Lent) on Sundays between the Divine Liturgies. Visiting confessors are also scheduled at special times during the Great Fast. Confessions are also heard on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Great and Holy Week to prepare for the observance of the Lord's Resurrection.

Anointing of the Sick – Parishioners who are seriously ill and those with life endangering medical conditions as well as those who are to undergo surgery should avail themselves of the sacrament of penance and anointing of the sick. If surgery is scheduled, please consider confession and anointing at the church before entering the hospital since there is more privacy for confession and less chance of interruption for confession and anointing. If you are unable to come to church, please call the rectory. Families of parishioners who have a medical emergency should contact the rectory office so one of the priests can go the hospital.

Holy Communion and Visitation of the Sick – Holy Communion is brought to our parishioners who are ill at the hospital or at home by the deacon on Sundays and at other times by arrangement. Please contact the deacon or the rectory office by Friday prior to the Sunday communion visitation.

Funeral Services – The Office of Christian Burial is offered in ways to accommodate the needs of the family. The Epiphany Ladies Guild as part of their charity offers a Mercy Meal for families at the Parish Center following the interment. Epiphany of our Lord cemetery is a portion of Fairfax Memorial Park. Parishioners who are interested in purchasing cemetery plots should see the deacon.

EPARCHIAL & OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Presbyteral Days. The priests of the Eparchy of Passaic received briefings from the commissions, committees, legal counsel, insurance, and two addresses from Bishop

Kurt Burnette. Some points of what were imparted are:

1. The Eparchial Handbook was issued by Bishop Burnette. The handbook had been begun by Bishop Skurla. Bishop Burnette referred to it as “a work in progress.”
2. Althans Insurance Company had updates to the implementation of the policy in hall rental contracts, kitchen and general equipment use and maintenance, and forms to be completed for reports on property and buildings. The health insurance plan has been amended to cover the wives and children of the married priests. This will require adjustments in the quarterly billing invoices.
3. The Bishop shared plans for a center for evangelization and for graduate level courses in theology, Sacred Scripture, and other disciplines. The Bishop also spoke about the Year of the Epistle, preaching (the Bishop spoke about content as well as reminded that priests that they will have to answer before the judgment seat of Christ whether they zealously preached the Good News not just in a brief or perfunctory manner), making parish web sites readable on mobile devices (a reason we were encouraged to switch the bulletins to a two column format was that it was easier to read on mobile devices), and a number of other initiatives the bishop has planned.
4. The new priests from Ukraine were introduced and welcomed.

Bishop Kurt reminded the priests that the only purpose of life is to die a saint. If you priests or your people are doing anything that impedes that purpose, get rid of it, he told the priests.

Prayers for our Parishioners. The particular law of the Byzantine Ruthenian Metropolitan Church directs: “The pastor is to celebrate the Divine Liturgy for the people of the parish entrusted to him on Sundays and days of precept [holy days of obligation]” (canon 294). This liturgy intention for all parishioners is “For the intention of our Parishioners.” The faithful who attend the Divine Liturgy for the parishioners participate, according to their state, in praying

for that intention. We can continue this prayer for one another during the week by remembering several parishioners and families each week. Holy Year-Merciful like the Father. Pope Francis asks us to be God-like and practice the Spiritual Works of Mercy and the Corporal Works of Mercy. The Paschal reflection regarding mercy can be seen from the gospel and apostolic reading appointed for the 6th Sunday of Pascha, the Man Born Blind. Jesus passes a man blind from birth and, in response to a question by His apostles and disciples, says that the man is blind in order to make visible the work of God. Jesus makes mud and creates eyes for the man just like the Book of Genesis describes God molding man from the dirt of the earth. So, Jesus is God making visible the work of God. And, the work of God is mercy on those who are suffering. The spiritual works of mercy in this gospel are “counseling the doubtful” and “instructing the ignorant.” The corporal work of mercy is to “visit the sick.” Say a prayer for all the wonderful medical professionals who have studied God’s visible creation and use it to heal and cure illness and infirmity. Say something encouraging to them. Give to the medical associations which seek funds to do research to discover cures. For the spiritual works of mercy remember that many people today have an incorrect notion of God. These attitudes in the culture can affect even the Faithful. Consider re-reading the Catholic Catechism for Adults (www.usccb.org to “Beliefs and Teachings”, then “What We Believe” then Catechism).

Fasting Regulations. Every Sunday is an Antipasch, a Return to the Pascha, a weekly

Easter. Every Friday is a weekly Great Friday. During the Great Fast, Fridays are days of fast, that is, we fast from meat. Now that Great Fast is complete, Fridays resume as Days of Penance, that is, we abstain from meat or we do an equivalent penitential act or an act of charity.

Jubilee Year Indulgences. Bishop Kurt has asked that in churches with a Holy Door, an appropriate prayer-service followed by the Sacrament of Penance should be offered once each month on the first or second Saturday. Our parish will be praying the Moleben to Jesus, the Lover of Mankind.
